



# Result of Concertino Praga – the Antonín Dvořák International Radio Competition for Young Musicians 2021

## Solo category 2<sup>nd</sup> round

The Jury session took place between April 19<sup>th</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> 2021 and the jury evaluated the recordings remotely. The Jurors listened to 25 solo recordings from Austria, Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Poland, Romania, Russia, Slovakia, Slovenia and Spain in following categories: piano (3), cello (4), flute (1), saxophone (1), violin (3), guitar (1), harp (2), clarinet (4), trumpet (3), French horn (1), accordion (1) and bassoon (1).

The competitors competed anonymously under the numbers. The Jury selected the following competitors for the final round, which will take place on September 18<sup>th</sup> 2021 in Prague:
