

The results of Concertino Praga – the Antonín Dvořák International Radio Competition for Young Musicians 2022

The jury sat between 25 and 29 April 2022 and evaluated the recordings remotely. The jury members listened to 38 solo recordings by competitors of Austrian, Azerbaijani, Belarussian, Bulgarian, Croatian, Czech, German, German/Mexican, Italian, Latvian, Polish, Romanian, Russian, Serbian, South Korean, Spanish, Taiwanese/Japanese and Ukrainian origin in the following categories: piano (13), flute (5), violin (4), trumpet (4), cello (4), oboe (3) clarinet (2), French horn (1), bassoon (1) and accordion (1).

The competitors were assessed anonymously under numbers. The jury selected the following competitors for the final round, which will take place on 16 September 2022 in Prague:
